The Mission

Train members of the Body of Christ to speak and help them find their voice. If the student is already an accomplished speaker, the goal is to make them even better and also help them find venues and platforms to speak from.

The Methods

Attend classes, do practical exercises, and read required textbooks. Students will primarily be trained in the dimensions of public ministry.

All students will be assigned to prepare messages and speak in class or at various venues. All will receive feedback regarding their content, style, and effectiveness. Students will be given opportunities to network with other pastors and churches to develop relationships and further speaking opportunities.

The Course length is 10 weeks, however, it is designed for flexibility. The course can be shortened or lengthened depending on needs or circumstances.

Students that complete all course requirements will graduate with a certificate. This course can fulfill 3.0 continuing education credits (CEU) hours depending on the recognizing institution, organization or business.

Schedule

Typically, classes are held on Saturday mornings for three hours. Speaking assignments will also be on Saturday mornings during classes and possibly some Sunday mornings at various locations. Students will be required to attend all classes and are encouraged to attend services where fellow students are speaking to provide evaluations and feedback.

- Learn the important distinctions and methods of preaching, teaching, giving testimonies and exhortations
- Overcome the obstacles that hinder effective speaking and content preparation
- Learn effective impromptu speaking

- Understand the dynamics of building a voice!
